Requirements:

- **500-word extended abstract**, detailing (1) the main thesis/question of your paper, (2) the contribution to the literature made by your paper, (3) some of the key steps in your paper's argument, (4) how your paper contributes to our theme
- Presenting speakers must be a **graduate student** (MSc, MPhil, PhD), or have not yet started a graduate program
- the abstract must be an **anonymised PDF** and should be sent to: PSGCabstract@gmail.com
- Deadline for submission: on or before **August 15th 2022**
- Talks will be **30 minutes followed by a 15 minute Q&A**

We explicitly welcome submission from students in fields outside of philosophy. We will notify selected speakers on or before September 3rd. If possible, the conference will be an **online/ in-person hybrid**, with in person talks held at LSE. Feel free to specify in your email with your attached abstract whether you prefer to attend in person or virtually.
